Word	Definition
Block	a large piece of a solid material that is square or rectangular in shape and usually has flat sides
Television	a piece of electrical equipment with a screen on which you can watch programmes with moving pictures and sounds
Run	to move using your legs, going faster than when you walk
Play	to do things for pleasure, as children do; to enjoy yourself, rather than work
Hide and Seek	a children's game in which one player covers his or her eyes while the other players hide, and then tries to find them
Butter	a soft yellow food made from cream, used in cooking and for spreading on bread
Toast	slices of bread that have been made brown and dry by heating them on both sides in a toaster or under a grill
Spicy	having a strong taste because spices have been added to it
Mangoes	a tropical fruit with smooth yellow or red skin, that is soft and orange inside with a large seed
Favourite	liked more than others of the same kind
Gatekeeper	a person whose job is to check and control who is allowed to go through a gate
Unattended	without the owner present; not being watched or cared for
Classroom	a room where a class of children or students is taught
Uniform	the special set of clothes worn by all members of an organization or a group at work, or by children at school
Activities	a thing that you do for interest or pleasure
Discipline	the practice of training people to obey rules and orders and punishing them if they do not; the controlled behaviour or situation that is the result of this training
Playground	an outdoor area where children can play, especially at a school or in a park or in a school playground
Neighbours	a person who lives next to you or near you
Neighbourhood	a district or an area of a town; the people who live there

Bench	a long seat for two or more people, usually made of wood
Masjid	a building where Muslims go for prayer
Gurdwaras	a building in which Sikhs worship
Temple	a building used for religious worship, especially in religions other than Christianity
Regularly	at regular intervals or times
Midday	12 o'clock in the middle of the day; the period around this time
Unclean	dirty and therefore likely to cause disease
Exercising	to do sports or other physical activities in order to stay healthy or become stronger; to make an animal do this
Grumpy	easily annoyed; in a bad mood
Germs	a very small living thing that can cause infection and disease
Trimmed	to make something neater, smaller, better, etc., by cutting parts from it
Foul	dirty and smelling bad
Marbles	a type of hard stone that is usually white and often has coloured lines in it. It can be polished (= made smooth and shiny by rubbing) and is used in building and for making statues, etc.
Coins	a small flat piece of metal used as money
Stranger	a person that you do not know
Traffic	the vehicles that are on a road at a particular time
Signal	a movement or sound that you make to give somebody information, instructions, a warning, etc.
